- Confirming our people suppliers are aware of and adherent to the Modern Slavery Act 2015
- Provide and communicate our external whistleblowing hotline service in multiple languages to all Employees, Agency workers and Sub Contractors.
- Provide awareness of Slavery and Human Trafficking in our company induction process.
- Carry out due diligence checks for employees of multiple bank account and address details.
- Carry out right to work checks on all employees and ensure the same processes are adhered to by all of our agency suppliers.
